MOCA February 6, 2024 GENERAL MEETING recap:

- New MOCA President, Lorraine Robinson, was announced following the resignation of President John McDonald.
- Beaverdam Flats Park parking lot presentation by Sheldon David, Parks Initiatives Field Coordinator, Calgary Parks and Open Spaces. The parking area is now under Mobility (City of Calgary Transportation). New signage will be replacing existing signs explaining that the parking lots will be treated as on street parking and all applicable bylaws will apply: 24 hr parking for vehicles which have not moved within 72 hours, towed. A three-week education program will run beginning February 12th. As for the easement issue, the ownership of these lots, as per the City of Calgary Law Dept, is the City of Calgary.

MOCA Hall Renovation Update:


- Interior plumbing and painting in the upper hall is nearing completion.
- Counters have been installed in the kitchen and upper hall bathrooms.
- New wiring for the kitchen and the lower level continues.

MOCA Hall Renovation Update Continued:

- Repair and replacement work to the T-bar ceiling in the upper hall is being done.
- The east stairs are installed. We continue to wait on the City for the proper permit so we can install the new access ramp.
 The balance of the exterior work will continue as weather permits.
- The required concrete support for the south stairs is in place so those stairs can be put back in place soon.
- The Upper Hall will be ready to welcome guests to MOCA's March 16th Dueling Piano event. Refer to the poster of the front page for details on ticket purchase: \$40/person.
- When the work on the hall is complete, the work on the MOCA office will begin. This will include a new furnace, new plumbing, flooring, painting and so on.

Jack Setters Arena Update:

Green Line Update:

- Phase 1 of Green Line builds 18 km of new light rail transit from Shepard to Eau Claire.
- Main construction starts in 2024 and will take approximately six years to construct. \$400M of construction is already completed or underway.
- Green Line will carry 55,000 riders on opening day, reducing travel time for transit users by up to 25 minutes.
 Drivers will also benefit by saving up to 10% in travel time due to decongestion.





MILLICAN OGDEN COMMUNITY HISTORY

Like the rest of Calgary, Millican-Ogden resides on Treaty 7 land, which opened to non-Indigenous settlement after the Treaty was signed in 1877. Ogden was formed by the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) in 1912 as a town to house the workers of the Ogden Shops. Named after I.G. Ogden, Vice President of the CPR in 1901, the small town to the east of Calgary originally consisted of 12 building.

The complex included a large freight car repair facility (up to 500 cars), a foundry, apprentice classroom, mess hall, paint shop, food services, doctors offices, volunteer fire department, and its own greenhouse and water tank. On May 28th, 1912 twenty-eight hundred lots were put on the market adjacent to the Ogden Shops. The lots offered CPR workers a chance to own their own home.

The small town atmosphere of Ogden was apparent from its formation. Just outside of Calgary, Ogden had its own banks, general stores, contractors, and markets. During World War II, the Ogden Shops were selected to produce war munitions. At this time, employment reached as high as 2,500 men.

The first two-room school was constructed in the community in 1912, located on the land which is now George Moss Park. with the boom of the railway, a new school was needed and in 1913 a four-room school was completed. This school sat alongside the old Ogden elementary school which is now home to the Almadina Language Charter Academy. Millican Ogden currently has four schools – Banting & Best, Sherwood School, St. Bernadette, and Almadina Language Charter Academy, along with multiple preschools in the area.

The Millican–Ogden Community Hall was opened in 1959, one year after the Millican–Ogden Outdoor Pool was started. The Jack Setters Arena was built in 1974.

Today, the community of Millican-Ogden is a vibrant neighborhood that has still retained some of its small town atmosphere. Many community members comment on what a great neighborhood it is to raise a family. Today, fifth generation Ogden residents continue to make their homes in the community, a testimony to the neighborhood's appeal.
